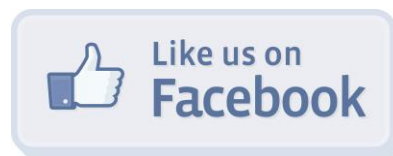
8) The Joint Prayer Group will not meet during July and August.
