5) EDEN Bus - Outreach Ministry to Young People

Some of you may have seen the EDEN Bus at Refuel in Fochabers last summer. It is a Christian outreach initiative to young people which tours around the country, usually going back to each location for 10-12 weeks at a stretch. It is run by representatives of The Message Project with support from a team of local volunteers who are trained up to engage more effectively with young people in their area. Most initiatives end up with 10-20 youngsters signing up for a Youth Alpha course and thereafter forming a lasting youth group. The bus itself is fully equipped with all the latest 'techie' gadgets as well as a climbing wall in the stairwell of the bus.

The Forres Youth and Families Outreach Project is keen to invite the Bus to come up to Moray - it is available at the moment in May/June - but in order to make it more manageable would ideally like to share it with other locations when it is up here.

This would not only defray the cost per se but also allow the bus to stay up here for a longer period without having to go backwards and forwards up and down the A9.

Moray Food Bank/Keith Foodstore
