2) CHRISTMAS FAYRE

The decision has been made that there **will** be a Christmas Fayre this year although there will have to be changes made to try to keep it as safe as possible.

It will be held on Saturday, 6 November in the Longmore Community Hall 10 am – 12 noon. There will only be teas/coffees – no soup and sweet.

5) REHIS Introduction to Food Hygiene level 1 by e-Learning

It is a legal requirement that anyone who handles or prepares food and drink is appropriately trained and/or supervised. This course is suitable for anyone who handles and prepares food and drink and will be especially useful for anyone who bakes at home on behalf of their congregation. This will help ensure that all members and volunteers have received suitable training.

This course will take approximately 2 hours to complete, is interactive and participants will be encouraged to reflect on their food safety knowledge and skills. There are no tests or exams during or after this course.

This course is delivered through a third party training partner and is entirely online so you will need access to a computer or tablet with a suitable internet connection. At the end of the course you will receive an approved REHIS Introduction to Food Hygiene certificate.
