MAF have items to sell today

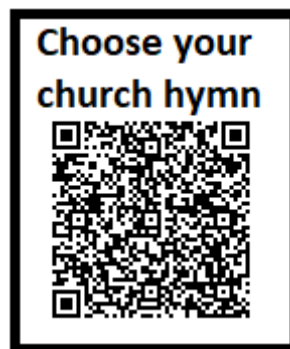
